The book of Nehemiah concludes with worship, covenant renewal, and a call to holiness. The joy of dedication and the seriousness of covenant remind us that God's people are set apart to live faithfully for Him.

READING PLAN

Day 1: Nehemiah 10:28-39. Covenant renewal with God

Day 2: Nehemiah 12:27-47. Dedication of the walls with joy

Day 3: Nehemiah 13:1-14. Guarding holiness in worship

Day 4: Nehemiah 13:15-31. Guarding holiness in daily life

Day 5: Revelation 21:1-5. God's ultimate restoration of His people

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. How does worship fuel ongoing mission?
2. What does covenant renewal look like for the Church today?
3. How can we guard against compromise and remain holy?

PRAYER, BURDEN, AND VISION

The story of Nehemiah begins not with action but with prayer. Faced with broken walls and a broken people, Nehemiah turns first to God in confession and dependence. His burden for Jerusalem reflects God's own heart to restore His people.

READING PLAN

Day 1: Nehemiah 1:1-11. Nehemiah's lament and prayer

Day 2: Isaiah 58. God's call to true fasting and rebuilding

Day 3: Nehemiah 2:1-10. Vision and favour from God

Day 4: Matthew 9:35-38. Jesus' compassion for the broken

Day 5: Ephesians 2:1-10. God's restoring work through Christ

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. What does Nehemiah's lament teach us about godly leadership?
2. Where do you see "ruins" in your life?
3. How do prayer and waiting on God clarify vision?

KEEP BUILDING

Psalm 51, Romans 12:1-2, Psalm 126

UNITY IN OPPOSITION

The rebuilding of Jerusalem's walls could not be done alone. Nehemiah gathered the people, and each family took their place in the work. Yet their unity was tested by ridicule, threats, and fear.

READING PLAN

Day 1: Nehemiah 3. Families rebuilding together

Day 2: Nehemiah 4:1-9. Facing ridicule and a prayerful response

Day 3: Nehemiah 4:10-23. Guarding the work with courage

Day 4: Acts 4:23-31. The Church prays for boldness in mission

Day 5: Hebrews 10:19-25. Encouraging one another in faith

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. How does unity advance God's mission?
2. How do we respond to ridicule, fear, or spiritual attack?
3. What opposition does the Church face today, and how should we respond?

INTEGRITY, JUSTICE, AND RENEWAL



Rebuilding God's people requires more than stone and mortar, it demands integrity, justice, and obedience to His Word. Nehemiah confronted injustice within the community and led the people back to Scripture, sparking confession and renewal.

READING PLAN

Day 1: Nehemiah 5:1-19. Confronting injustice

Day 2: Nehemiah 6:1-19. Standing firm

Day 3: Nehemiah 8:1-12. The Word brings revival

Day 4: Nehemiah 8:13-18 & 9:1-3. Confession

Day 5: Nehemiah 9:4-37. Remembering God's faithfulness through history

REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. How do internal struggles threaten God's work?
2. Why is Scripture central to revival?
3. What role do justice and mercy play in restoration?
